Council posts annual science review of LOBO

The Delta Stewardship Council (Council) has posted a [report from the annual science review of the Long-term Operations Biological Opinions \(LOBO\)](#). The report synthesizes the findings of a panel of independent scientists who reviewed the implementation of actions required by the Endangered Species Act for salmon, steelhead, green sturgeon, and delta smelt to operate the State and federal water projects.

Conservation assessment public comments requested

DWR and the California Department of Fish and Wildlife (CDFW) request public comments on the recently completed [Volume 1](#) of the *Cache Slough Complex Conservation Assessment*. The conservation assessment evaluates the potential for restoring the Cache Slough Complex as part the Fish Restoration Program and provides information on the current and historic conditions of the Cache Slough Complex in order to generate a regional landscape conceptual model for conservation.
